A Great Modern Jesuit

Fr. Joseph Edassery S. J. (Vice Principal)



This 27th successor of St Ignatius had all the characteristic traits of Ignatius and not a few consider him as the 'second founder' of the Jesuit Society.

He was born in Bilbao, the Basque country of Spain on 14th November, 1907. Last year, the Jesuits celebrated his birth centenary commemorating the manifold apostolic initiatives he had undertaken.




later he was able to speak convincingly about this self - destruction of human race.

As Superior General of the Society of Jesus, he introduced drastic changes in the administration and apostolic dimension of the modern Jesuits. He challenged the Jesuits to have a deep concern for the social problems of the world and gave a new drive for inculturation and wanted the Jesuits to meet the challenges of the modern world with an open mind. The Jesuit Refugee Service was started during his tenure as General of the Society.

He refocused the apostolic endeavours of the society and motivated the Jesuits all over the world to dream of a new future that would be quite different from the present day world. He constantly reminded the Jesuits never to be content with the status quo, but



Arrupe's leadership of the Society of Jesus was decisively marked by the thrust he gave to the Society's 'option for the poor' and the 'promotion of justice'. He wanted the Jesuit alumni to be 'men for others'.



After his schooling, he enrolled in the faculty of medicine of Madrid University. He interrupted his study of medicine and joined the Society of Jesus in 1927. As a Jesuit, he had to experience various life situations in diverse contexts and continents and was exposed to various cultures and religions. He was an eye witness to the devastating atom bomb explosion that totally annihilated Hiroshima on 6th August, 1945. At that time he was the novice master and superior of the Jesuit house. He immediately converted his novitiate into a make shift hospital. The training he had before joining the society as a medical student came in handy for him and thus he was able to save hundreds of wounded people. This first hand experience of human misery left an indelible mark on him and

be driven to rediscover, to redefine and reach out for the magis. Frontiers and boundaries are not obstacles for Jesuits but new challenges to be faced and new opportunities to be welcomed.

Father Arrupe remains a shining example of creative thinking. The ups and downs and the upheavals of life only bring forth more colour, more strength and a richer experience of the divine powers within us. He has handed over this priceless legacy to the Jesuits and to all their students.


And as the curtain fell after the drama with the National Anthem playing in the background we all had one thought, that this was a day to remember.
